## International Initiatives (Trisha Hasbrouck) -

## Membership (Shelley Gerringer/Mary Giunta) -

- Since the last Board Executive Meeting in November, membership has increased by 61 new memberships (50 alone coming from College and University Rep side). This is probably due to the MOACAC Spring Conference.
- Active Membership is sitting at 667 members (this is 88% from last year of 773). Our goal for this year was 60% so we exceeded this goal by 28%.

## Professional Development (Darren Meeker) -

NEW CO-CHAIR! - Cabrina Noonan - Ritenour High School - College & Career Counselor Cabrina will oversee Tools of the Trade and STL CUBE, and Darren Meeker will continue with KC CUBE and College Counseling Institute.

Events are being planned as in-person events as of right now, and we are working on locations for all programs.

Tools of the Trade will be in early August.

STL CUBE will be held September 1, with KC CUBE on September 2.

There won't be a mid-MO CUBE, but we will hopefully have virtual options.

College Counseling Institute will be held mid-October.

# College Fairs (Andrew Laue/Michelle Luraschi) -

Executed 6 x 6 college fairs in March and April targeting high school students. A 6 x 6 fair will be held on April 22 specifically for transfer students. Total revenue to MOACAC from the spring programs will be \$12,950.

Currently planning a fall in-person college fair calendar, which will likely be supplemented by virtual college fairs. Release of the in-person fair schedule will be in mid-May. There continues to be a significant amount of uncertainty regarding exactly how fall programming will manifest itself. We are also monitoring decisions being made by NACAC, and are in regular communication with Strive Scan regarding their planning, and the planning of their partners. Michelle Luraschi steps down as co-chair on May 17; Katie Vargas begins as new co-chair. **Technology** (Mark Nothum) -

Mark is staying on for a second term as our technology chairperson! Volume of registrations through the website increased, but it was handled easily Updates to the site are regularly made in order to stay up-to-date

# Spring Conference (Abby Jelavich/Dixie Williams) -

- Thanks to everyone for conference attendance/ and thanks to the conference committee for their hard work.
- Report out on final numbers (i.e. a quick conference recap): number of attendees (170), vendors (6). Sessions were well attended.

Treasurers (Tim Eggleston/Meredith Buschmann/Lindsay Tobin) -


- Current funds as of April 1st:

  - Money Market: \$26,041.86


o Paypal: \$15,046.53

- We continue to monitor budgets and spending. With the vaccine rollout, hopefully, next fiscal year will look a bit more like previous years and additional revenue can be generated.
- Our commitment is to still fully fund the IAS committee since it directly impacts students financially, college access, students of different socioeconomic backgrounds and diversity training for our executive board.
- Because of this being a unique year, we have been working with the committees to offer free or reduced pricing options to members for events.
- Our biggest source of income for FY 20-21 has been membership, Show Me My Future (fall and spring) and conference.
- This spring, we moved \$50,000 over from our money market account into Edward
  Jones. As a result, one of our goals for next year is to start ironing out an endowment
  policy that will be able to support MOACAC in perpetuity with scholarships and other
  activities for our members and students. We will work with our financial advisor at
  Edward Jones along with the Presidents to have a policy in place and ready to go for FY
  22-23.





# Bus Tour (Jennifer Tanner) -

Decision was made to pause the bus tour for 2021 due to the pandemic. We are hopeful that the bus tour will resume summer 2022.
