- VII. Government Relations (Katie Vargas-not present)
  - A. 102nd General Assembly Legislative Recap: January 4th, 2024-May 30th 2024 (Bills related to our work that passed into Law):
  - B. <u>SB727</u>- Creates & modifies provisions relating to elementary & secondary education, including: MO Empowerment Scholarship Accounts Program, minimum school term, charter schools, elementary student literacy, MO Course Access & Virtual School Program, Family Paced Education, school board vacancies, weighted average daily attendance, early childhood programs, small schools grants, minimum teacher's salary, compulsory school attendance/school attendance officers, recovery high schools, teacher certification, hard-to-staff schools & subject areas, teacher education programs, the Career Ladder Program, PSRS/PEERS working after retirement, teacher recruitment & retention scholarship program
  - C. <u>HB3</u>- Appropriates money for the expenses, grants, refunds, and distributions of the Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development. Passed, w/ partial Governor vetoes in the following areas:
    - \$1 million allocation for the Returning Heroes Program expectation is for higher education institutions to continue to assume the associated costs
    - \$1.3 million from the expansion of the MO State-West Plains Nursing & Allied Health Program
    - 3. \$5 million from the University of MO's Agricultural Extension Service
  - D. <u>HB2287</u>- Modifies provisions related to the virtual school program
  - E. <u>HB2002</u>- Appropriates money for the expenses, grants, refunds, and distributions of the State Board of Education and DESE. Passed, w/ partial Governor vetoes in the following areas:
    - 1. \$1 million from the Missouri Career Advising Program
    - 2. \$250k for homeless student impact centers
    - 3. \$3 million for middle school STEM intervention program
    - 4. \$50k from the summer enrichment program
    - 5. \$100k for a teacher recruitment & retention organization
    - 6. \$250k for a non-profit computer training technology & robotics program
    - 7. \$10 million from the DESE Federal Emergency Relief 2021 Fund
    - 8. \$700k for a turn-key STEM-focused program

- 9. \$100k for a teacher residency program
- 10. \$100k for a literacy enrichment program
- 11. \$10 million for the Close the Gap Program
